## **OBJECTIVES AND ACTIVITIES**

The object of Dundee Choral Union is the practice and performance in public or private of music of a high standard.

The main activities carried on by Dundee Choral Union are the performance of at least two public performances in each financial year, as well as the running of a 100 Club.

#### ACHIEVEMENTS AND PERFORMANCE

The results of the year are set out in the Statement of Receipts and Payments.

Season 2022/23 was very much a case of getting back to normal after the COVID 19 pandemic. DCU performed two concerts of high calibre, both in the Caird Hall. In view of the drop in sponsorship the previous year, concerts were staged with small instrumental and organ accompaniments, the result of which was that we managed to keep within budget. In December 2022 we sang Britten's Ceremony of Carols along with other Christmas music, and in March 2023 we performed Chilcott's St John Passion. Both concerts were well received by our audiences which numbered around 300 at each performance.

We are very pleased to have twelve new members join us this season. With rising membership and sponsorship, we hope next season will be very successful.

## FINANCIAL REVIEW

Sponsorship this year has returned to its pre-pandemic levels and thanks are due to all sponsors for their generosity, and to our sponsorship secretary who has worked so hard to restore this.

We shall be applying to our regular sponsors again in 2023/24 and some new ones. Our target will be to raise £15,000. Adding to this our income from membership subscriptions and ticket sales, we can now afford the planned programme for 2023/24 season which will include performances of Rossini's La Petite Messe Solennelle in December 2023 and Handel's Messiah in Spring 2024. These are well known and popular works and will hopefully bring in a greater revenue from ticket sales.

#### PLANS FOR FUTURE PERIODS

Costs of hiring musicians, singers and venues continue to rise. Consideration needs to be given to the affordability of performing two concerts per season in the Caird Hall. The joy of singing in this venue and having the backing of Caird Hall publicity and ticket sales has to be balanced with the cost of about £2,000 per performance hire.

In the future, perhaps a major work performed in the Caird Hall and a small concert in a less expensive venue per season may be the way forward. The committee and members need to make a decision about this.

The 2024/25 season plans are well underway. Adverts on Facebook and flyers at Freshers Week are new ways of trying to attract new members. We have been encouraged by the number of new members in 2022/23.

## RESERVES POLICY

The Committee has established a policy to maintain unrestricted funds, which are the free reserves of the charity, and which amount to £34,759, at a level to cover expected expenditure for a period of 18 months. The committee considers that reserves as reported are sufficient to comply with the policy.

#### RISK MANAGEMENT

The Committee has reviewed the major risks to which the charity is exposed, in particular those related to the operations and finances of the charity, and is satisfied that systems have been established to manage the charity's exposure to the major risks.

# INDEPENDENT EXAMINER'S REPORT TO THE TRUSTEES OF DUNDEE CHORAL UNION

## YEAR ENDED 30 APRIL 2023

I report on the accounts of the charity for the year ended 30 April 2023 which are set out on pages 7 to 10.

## RESPECTIVE RESPONSIBILITIES OF TRUSTEES AND EXAMINER

## NOTES TO THE ACCOUNTS

#### YEAR ENDED 30 APRIL 2023

#### 1. BASIS OF ACCOUNTING

These accounts have been prepared on the Receipts and Payments basis in accordance with the terms of the Charities and Trustee Investment (Scotland) Act 2005 ("the 2005 Act") and the Charities Accounts (Scotland) Regulations 2006 (as amended) ("the 2006 Regulations").

#### 2. NATURE AND PURPOSE OF FUNDS

Funds are classified as either restricted or unrestricted funds, defined as follows:

Unrestricted funds are donations and other incoming resources receivable or generated for the objects of the charity without further specified purpose and are available as general funds.

Restricted funds are to be used for specific purposes as laid down by the donor. Expenditure which meets these criteria is charged to the fund together with a fair allocation of management and support costs.

#### 3. TRUSTEES' REMUNERATION

Remuneration was paid to Trustees for services as a Trustee during the year amounted to £nil (2022 - £nil). As a matter of course, the charity refunds to Trustees any costs paid by them personally in relation to the normal operation of the charity and pays fees to the Musical director and the Accompanist, who are both Trustees (see note 9).
